In 2009 a group of individuals came together to discuss the need for a comfort care home in Seneca County. Several of them were Seneca County residents who worked in hospice programs and had seen the need for this service.

Community support made it possible for Pathway to purchase a home on Mound Road in Tyre in October 2015. Pathway accepted its first resident on Feb. 28, 2017, and since then has cared for 131 people.

Consider Becoming a Pathway Volunteer

Pathway Home could not provide the service to individuals and their families without the commitment by volunteers who provide care to our residents 16 hours each day. (An 8-hour night shift is covered by paid staff.)

Pathway makes it possible for people who are unable to stay at home get hospice care in a home-like atmosphere. Families can and do remain involved in the resident's life. We do not restrict visitation.

Volunteers provide patient care in the same way a family member would if the resident was at home. Support from professionals is available if needed.

We ask you to consider becoming a Pathway volunteer. Volunteers receive the training they need from our staff; no prior experience or qualifications are required. Volunteers determine when they will be able to work.

Resident care volunteers work 4-hour shifts from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. each day. The shift may involve bathing, turning and repositioning, giving medications and other care giver tasks. It also involves a lot of laughter, lightheartedness and great conversations.
